Program: Maryellen Symer CTE Career & Technical Education

Maryellen Symer is the Assistant Superintendent of the BH-BL School Curriculum and Instruction. She spoke about the CTE program, Career and Technical Education, which is a kindergarten through adult area of study. This program was designed around the BH-BL 21st Century Framework for Learning, which includes the essential skills, knowledge, expertise and attitudes students must possess to succeed in school, post-secondary education, work and life. BH-BL CTE is available at all school levels as follows:

- Elementary creating Awareness through career days, speaker and field trips
- Middle School encouraging Exploration through Business Digital Literacy classes, Home and Careers and Technology Education
- High School Continued Exploration and Application through Business, Family and Consumer Services, Technology Education and Vo-Tec Opportunities

Other CTE opportunities include: Dual enrollment for college credit for 8 courses; distance learning network; work studies program; career exploration internship program; clubs and competitions such as FBLA and FIRST Challenge; Vo-Tec Center Programming at both Capital Region BOCES and Saratoga BOCES.

When asked why the district doesn't rely on the NYS education guidelines, Maryellen responded that BH-BL strives not just to meet the minimum standards but to go above and beyond!
