## Buddy Blankets and Bears Elizabeth Osborn



At our meeting, held at the Ballston Town Hall, we had the distinct pleasure of listening to the remarkable story of perseverance and determination of Elizabeth Osborn and her son, who started the nonprofit "Buddy Blankets and Bears".

Elizabeth told the emotional story of how her son Blade came up with the idea of Buddy Blankets. Elizabeth has successfully battled cancer multiple times throughout her life and it was during one of her first chemo treatments that her young son would go to the hospital with her during these treatments. He sat with her most days but noticed an elderly gentleman sitting in the corner alone and brought him a blanket and sat near him. He talked with him and found out this elderly man was a veteran and Blade loved hearing his military stories. Blade would then sit and talk with this elderly man during every treatment he went to with his mom; often helping when he became sick and nauseated from the chemo treatments. On his mother's last day of treatment, Blade looked for his friend in his usual spot in the corner but he wasn't there. Blade hesitantly asked the nurses and was informed that he had passed away the night before. It was from that point in Blade's life that he would dedicate his time to helping veterans battling cancer. He didn't want anyone to feel alone during their treatments.

Knowing he couldn't sit with all the sick veterans across the world, he thought about what he could do and came up with the idea of providing them blankets like he had done for his friend. Blade never knew the name of the elderly gentleman he befriended in the hospital but called him by the name Buddy and named his organization after him, Buddy Blankets.

Over the years the organization has grown to include Buddy Bears and Tammy Buddy Bears, which are named after a family friend who died of cancer. Blade expanded from just blankets for veterans to all adults battling cancer and to bears for all children going through cancer treatments as well. He used his own money to make his organization a 501(c)3 nonprofit. His program has expanded to multiple chapters at different colleges.

Blade has recently added mental health and anti-bullying to his initiatives that his organization supports. He travels to multiple colleges and high schools telling his story of his friend Buddy, his organization, and his own struggles with mental health and bullying. He recruits new members and chapters and strictly has students only working for his organization.
